RESPONSIBILITIES

- Maintain good working order of the vehicle by performing regular inspections, and maintenance duties such as cleaning, and fueling
- Empty donation bins of bags of clothing and excess items, ensure items conform to established guidelines
- Clean up any debris surrounding bin
- Load and unload truck at determined locations
- Maintain a good pace throughout the day to achieve targets
- Move bins to desired locations as required
- Pick up donations at other locations as required
- Maintain reports such as work records for invoicing purposes, and log books for day program activities
- Directs assistants and or volunteers in the loading or unloading of the vehicle
- Perform other duties as required

- Be prepared to work in all weather conditions typical of Vancouver
- Safely operate large trucks, vans and trailers

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

This position requires flexible hours of work in order to coordinate events and activities that may occur in the evenings and on weekends outside of typical business hours. This is a physically demanding job with an expectation of daily handling numerous heavy bags full of clothing. Some days of work will be alone, some other days a crew member from Don't Sweat It Services will assist with the servicing of the bins.
