INCLUSION ART EXHIBITION ILLUSTRATES LIVED EXPERIENCE OF DISABILITY

Burnaby, BC —It's Community Living Month in BC, and *posAbilities* is pleased to present the 11th annual [INCLUSION Art Show & Sale](#) featuring the recent and original work of more than 150 BC artists with disabilities on October 28-29, 2015 at Heritage Hall in Vancouver.

This show brings together artists of all capabilities whose work inspires community and has the potential to dismantle barriers and perceptions of ability. Many of the artists have curated their own collections and are present at the show. Guests can engage with them to discover how their creations manifest the lived experience of disability.

On October 28, 2015 from 6:00-6:15pm, there will be brief opening night address to learn about the collective impact of an inclusive arts community from representatives of: the City of Vancouver, Community Living BC, BC Government Employees Union and *posAbilities*.

Interesting Facts

- All works are original (paintings, photography, pottery, jewellery, art cards/crafts etc.).
- Over 500 pieces of art will be on exhibition and for sale this year.
- 90% of the sales price of each item sold is returned to the artist.
- The show's sales were over \$8,000 in 2014.
- 8 studios sponsored by Community Living Organizations across Metro Vancouver participate.
- Several artists are co-emceeing the show.

This annual Art Show aims to foster an inclusive arts community, where differences are celebrated.
