

Rights of Children and Youth

While receiving services at *pos*Abilities, children and youth have the right to:

Be treated fairly with respect and dignity. This includes freedom from any form of abuse and discrimination. **Life, survival, and development.** This includes
the basic necessities and
opportunities to learn and grow.

All information related to the service, so an informed decision about participating or withdrawing from service can be made.

Have cultural heritage, spiritual beliefs and gender identity be recognized and respected.

Receive timely, professional and ethical services that focus on the best interests of the child/youth.

Confidentiality and security of all information gathered during the course of the service.

Express opinions, values, and beliefs that are considered in program development and impact service.
