Use your Access 2 and CNIB Card for the comedy 'The Play That Goes Wrong'

The Play That Goes Wrong is essentially about a theatre company who put on a play, a murder mystery, and what can go wrong; does! This play was chosen as a RP candidate by our autistic and neurodivergent consultant team.

The Access 2 card is for individuals with a permanent disability who require the support of a companion/Personal Support Worker (PSW) when attending a show. The Arts Club recognizes the Access 2 card and the Canadian National Institute for the Blind (CNIB) card, meaning that we grant the holder any seat that best meets their accessibility requirements, along with a free admission for their companion/PSW, for any of our productions.

New Sudbury hub aims to improve access for and deaf-blind and deaf communities

Marjan Massoom for CBC News shares that Sensity and the Bob Rumball Centre for the Deaf have opened a shared hub in Sudbury to improve access to services for people who are deaf, hard of hearing, and deaf-blind across northern Ontario. The partnership will provide referrals, training, outreach, and community support while helping address barriers such as distance, limited local resources, and unreliable internet access in remote communities. Leaders say the new hub will strengthen connections and expand support as demand for services grows in the region.
